DEACON'S DESK


Dear Quad Parishes Family:

So, here I am, sitting at the computer, a glass of Cabernet Sauvignon on one side and in back of me, Prince Phillip (no relation to HRH Prince Phillip) has been trapped in the tower by the vengeful Maleficent. Even now the three fairies are trying to rescue him. As you may be able to tell, we have the Green Bay grandchildren. They were excited to see Nana and Papa when we came home this last weekend. Vienna (New York) wanted to come to Nana's home. May I confess something that may not seem too diaconal; unless you read about Jesus saying to suffer the little children; Karen and I are encouraging that type of insurrection. Since my son is Catholic and my daughter-in-law is Jewish, why not play on the wealth of both traditions? Mea culpa, Mea culpa, Mea maxima culpa!

The weekend you are reading this, we will be in South Bend as Jeremy and Jessica's sponsors for Confirmation. I'd like to propose family being designated a sacrament! I believe it already is in some senses because doing family responsibilities gives grace to the doer and honors the Giver (God) no matter what the family constitutes. That's as much as I care to enter the hallowed halls of Theology.

The frenzy around this part of our summer/fall reminds me of the Gospel. The Pharisee recited all that he had, all he had done and his disdain for those with fewer possessions and less status than he, especially the tax collector, who, as a collaborator with the Roman occupiers, was seen as a traitor to his race. On the other hand, the tax collector made his prayer not about himself, but about the mercy of God and his understanding of his need for forgiveness. It is amazing how many of Jesus' lessons of piety, fidelity and love are actually shown through the lives and actions of the lowliest among his people, the outcasts, the lost, the shunned and vilified, somewhat like Our Savior at the time of the Passion. On my journeys through Facebook, I have found quite a few Pharisees and few of the sinners ready to repent and care for their brothers and sisters. I try to correct, with Church teachings, some of the posts, but I find that this can get me some nasty responses. I can understand that though. I have never hid that like many of the Church teachings, especially since Leo XIII, I tend to bend to the left. I am a self-described tree hugger and snowflake. Why hide it? I hope that, if that offends you, you will connect with me and we can talk, without any judgment or coercion.

Well, Prince Phillip has awakened Sleeping Beauty with "loves first kiss" (reminds me of Baptism), so I sign off. Peace and Blessings,

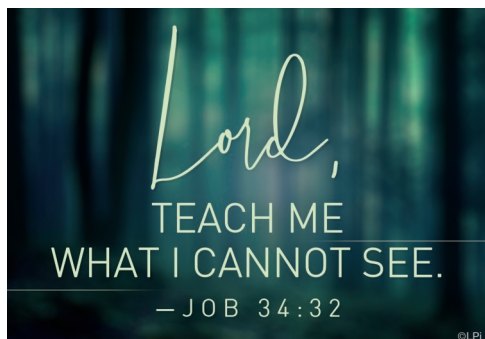

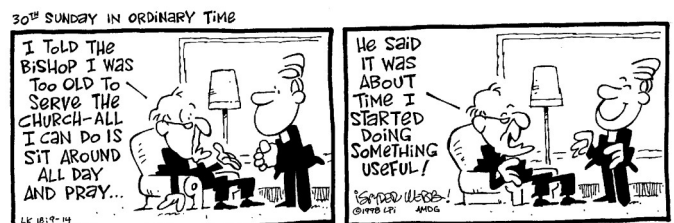

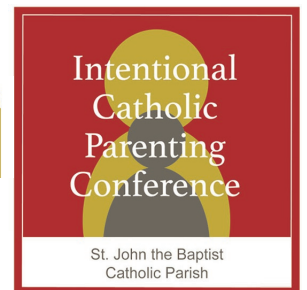

ATTN: SCRIP CARD USERS

When you pay with scrip or a gift card, do you sometimes have a small balance left on the card? Would you consider donating that card to those in need? We often get walk-ins requesting money to purchase gas, food, or prescriptions. The small balances left on your gift cards could add up to be enough to help someone have their next meal, pick-up a prescription, or purchase gas to get to a doctor appt, an out-of-town funeral, or to work the next day. Cards can be dropped in the collection baskets, or at the Quad-Parish or Faith Formation Office. It would be helpful if you would indicate the balance left on the card.

Parishioners who are unable to attend Mass due to illness or incapacity may request a Minister of Care to visit and bring Communion. Those seriously impaired by sickness or old age may also request the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Please call Sr. Jan at the Quad-Parish Office, 496-2160. If it is an emergency after hours, please call 617-8646.

To help us keep track of our parishioners, we ask that families (and neighbors) let us know when a loved one or neighbor is homebound, in a nursing home or in an assisted living facility so that we can provide visits and care. Also, please let us know if someone is receiving Hospice Care so Pastoral Care can be provided at this difficult time.

Hospitalization
