

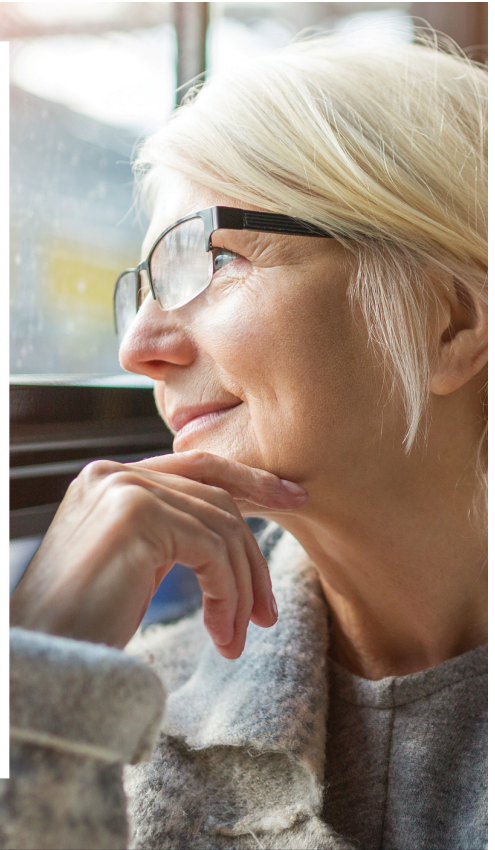

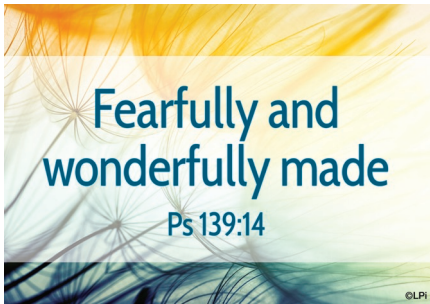

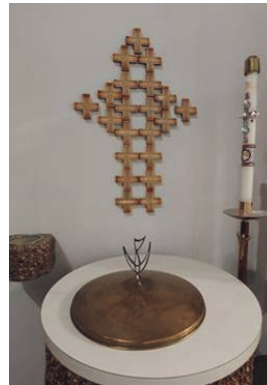

For 20 years, the Funding Factory has been helping organizations like ours fundraise by recycling toner and inkjet printer cartridges. When you pay with scrip or a gift card, do you sometimes have a small balance left on the card? Would you consider donating that card to those in need?
