



Prepare Him Room

During previous seasons of Advent, we have discussed being open and welcoming to one another as we prepare our hearts and minds for fully participating in Mass. We have discussed the themes of the weeks (hope, light, joy, faith) of advent in an effort to prepare our hearts and minds, for the miracle in which we are about to partake during Mass. This year, let us direct our preparation to our identity as Catholics. As we prepare our



hearts and minds, we can more fully be aware of the language of love in which God speaks to us, body - mind - and soul. We can more fully hear the language of love, throughout the liturgy, in prayers and readings, that unite us as family. It is about relationship; our relationship to Jesus and our relationship to one another. Who are we? Who is God for us? Who has created us? What are we created to do? When are we ready? How shall we live?

Genesis 1:27 - "God created mankind in his image; in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them."

Since God is outside of time, she was able to receive the graces of Christ's redemption. Mary did not experience the effects of the Fall. That doesn't mean she didn't have free will! At the Annunciation, Mary could have rejected Gabriel's invitation, just as Eve rejected God in the garden. With Mary's yes to God's plan, she is often called the New Eve, as Jesus is the New Adam. Their fidelity restores what was lost to us in the Fall.



Blessing of an Advent Wreath



The use of the Advent Wreath is a traditional practice which has found its place in the Church as well as in the home. The blessing of an Advent Wreath takes place on the First Sunday of Advent or on the evening before the First Sunday of Advent.

When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another member of the family.

All make the sign of the cross as the leader says:

Our help is in the name of the Lord.

(R/.) Who made heaven and earth.

Then the Scripture, Isaiah 9: (lines 1-2 and 5-6) or Isaiah 63 (lines 16-17 & 19) or Isaiah 64 (lines 2-7) is read:

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

(R/.) Thanks be to God.

Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, he is the Savior of every nation. Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord. (R/.) Amen.

The blessing may conclude with a verse from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel":

O come, desire of nations, bind in one the hearts of humankind; bid ev'ry sad division cease and be thyself our Prince of peace. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

- -- It is the cold and flu season. What to do about greetings at mass? Please note: We will not discontinue the greeting at the beginning of mass or the sign of peace. If you do not wish to shake hands during these times, offer a verbal greeting. You can acknowledge the greeting of the other person with a bow and verbal response, a two finger sign of peace or the "fist pump" is always an option. If the person next to you does not offer a hand-shake, do not be offended but accept their choice for no physical contact at mass. A reminder also. If you have a cold or the flu please refrain from receiving the Precious Blood of Christ. Although there have been no proven cases of passing on an illness (The alcohol content of the wine, the wiping of the cup and the turning of the cup takes care of the germs.), it is proper to refrain. When you receive either the Body of Christ or the Blood of Christ you are receiving the fullness of Christ's presence.







SEVERE WEATHER

ATTN: SCRIP CARD USERS

When you pay with scrip or a gift card, do you sometimes have a small balance left on the card? Would you consider donating that card to those in need? We often get walk-ins requesting money to purchase gas, food, or prescriptions. The small balances left on your gift cards could add up to be enough to help someone have their next meal, pick-up a prescription, or purchase gas to get to a doctor appt, an out-of-town funeral, or to work the next day. Cards can be dropped in the collection baskets, or at the Quad-Parish or Faith Formation Office. It would be helpful if you would indicate the balance left on the card.

Do you have a special need for prayer? If you or someone you know needs a few extra prayers said for them, you can call the Quad-Parish Office at 496-2160.

Homebound or Nursing Home Visits/ Communion Calls

Parishioners who are unable to attend Mass due to illness or incapacity may request a Minister of Care to visit and bring Communion. Those seriously impaired by sickness or old age may also request the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Please call Sr. Jan at the Quad-Parish Office, 496 -2160. If it is an emergency after hours, please call 617-8646.

To help us keep track of our parishioners, we ask that families (and neighbors) let us know when a loved one or neighbor is homebound, in a nursing home or in an assisted living facility so that we can provide visits and care. Also, please let us know if someone is receiving Hospice Care so Pastoral Care can be provided at this difficult time.

Hospitalization

Please ask admitting personnel to inform your parish whenever you or a loved one is hospitalized. If at all possible either a priest or a pastoral associate will visit. Privacy concerns do not permit the hospital to initiate the contact.
