Mary, Did You Know?

As we come to the Fourth Sunday of Advent and the celebration of the Solemnity of the Birth of Jesus itself, I often find myself reflecting on Our Blessed Virgin. This is the time also when we might have grown tired of the Christmas carols, the glittering lights, the Christmas cards showing us who we didn't send one to, the continuous advertisements and the message that "you need this thing to have a happy Christmas and only if you possess this item will that happiness come to you." Then, once again, I reflect on Mary and Joseph and John the Baptizer and all of the many unknown people who were able to recognize the tremendous gift that is given to us in the Birth of Jesus. Could there possibly be an iPad, notebook, decoration scheme, string of lights that could give the type of happiness and joy that comes from this celebration? And once again, I return to reflect on Mary, the love that accepted the request that gave us the Savior.



I have to confess that this was not my usual approach to this holiday until I heard the a Capella group Pentatonix ask some thought provoking questions to reflect on in their recording of "Mary, Did You Know?" The song itself is beautiful, but the questions inspire me to awe at the sheer beauty of the "let it be done to me as you say." There is joy at the end of our Advent Journey and hopefully, we have spent some of the last four weeks preparing the way of the Lord to come into our lives.

When I think of these questions, all of the worldly concerns fall away. "Mary did you know that your baby boy would save our sons and daughters?" In my own simple way, we are beholden to our Mother for her part in the love given to us by God in the Birth of His Son.

"When you kiss your little Baby, you kiss the face of God." What a powerful image; this human being kissed the face of God, just as our own mothers would kiss our faces and perhaps as we have kissed our own children's faces. How truly joyful is the image of God being loved and nurtured like the little Baby He was, how humble is His love for us that He would come to us in the most vulnerable human state. Even if we have no children, we have performed or witnessed this act of comfort, joy and reassurance.

"That sleeping Child you're holding is the great I AM." This is the true gift of God, the beginning of the evolution of God's relationship with us. I AM, the name of God, first revealed to Moses from the Burning Bush.

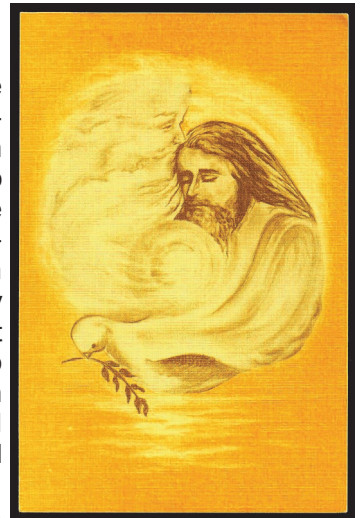
All of these questions lead to some central pillars of our faith; Jesus is both truly Divine and born truly human of a human mother. These words and the Gospels remind us that Jesus lived, died and rose for our salvation. Most important of all, He gave us the gift of His Real Presence in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. There are just some stories that are worth repeating and celebrating.

So, as we go through this Christmas week, I hope you have just a little time to contemplate how much you and your families, friends and humanity has been loved by God.

Prepare Him Room

It is relationship that we seek. And, God desires relationship with us, partaking in every moment. God came to us as a baby, vulnerable to the world and the humble conditions that He was born into. Do you wonder if Mary was afraid, or if her perfect faith surpassed all doubt? Do you ever ponder if Joseph ever reconsidered his part and his promise - to nurture and protect Mary and Jesus?



Have you ever put your head into your hands and cried through a painful moment or physically become shaken by the emotion of a moment at hand, only to cry out to God for council and comfort? Life is full of choices and decisions, and effects from those personal judgments. What could we accomplish in complete faith? It turns out that we will not know; as even the greatest of saints have not known the perfection of Mary - humble faith without doubt or question. However, what we can realize is that God is always ready to work in our life, should we contemplate and seek the knowledge. God is always ready to comfort and console and guide.

I would like to know each of you by your names and faces, by your joy in our shared faith, and how I can pray with you through struggles. Relationship has always been important to me, and throughout my life. Relationship has become a desire, planted in my heart by the Holy Spirit. I feel called to know you, and to know God through you.

What if we began our introductions to one another, in an effort to get to know each other, with a brief summary of how the liturgy and sacraments have meant something throughout our lives? What liturgy means to me... What has changed me... What has lifted me up when I have fallen... How have God's works been made known to me... How do I see God at work in my life?

My life began in 1978 as the first-born baby to my parents, whose intention it was to raise me in the Catholic faith. I was baptized when I was an infant. I attended a Catholic grade school and made my First Communion in 2nd grade, followed by my first Reconciliation in 5th grade. I was confirmed in my junior year of high school. In 2002, I entered into the sacrament of marriage with my husband, Mark.

There were many years between my baptism and marriage. I struggled with my relationships, with my faith, with my purpose in life, and with what I was called to do. And, God was there, with my guardian angels to keep me safe; that I might one day turn to him with head and hand and heart, searching for intentional faith filled relationship.

When I consider the gifts of the Holy Spirit, which were given in the abundance of God, through the sacraments I received, it is the sacrament of marriage from which the gifts grew fruitful; not of the lack of presence or greatness of the gifts received from all of the sacraments, but in my ability to take part in what was offered.

God called out to me time and time again and I began to reach for the "hands of Jesus," to desire the loving embrace of our Lord in prayer.

We are ready to celebrate the birth of Jesus - Christmas! What a gift, that we might reach out with head and hand and heart to the infant Christ, born to humble human life, that we might gain back relationship that was lost with God the Father, from the fall. And, as we celebrate with loved ones during the Christmas season, let us see the gift that we are to one another.

Will you pray, together, with me? From our inception, it is He who knows every fiber of our being; from the hairs on our head to our most intimate thoughts. From our birth, we are set out on a spiritual journey to find our way back to Him. By our creation, we were chosen. In our baptism, we are made heirs. With our anointing, we are called. Through every prayer, we are loved. With every breath, we are beckoned to follow. In every difficulty, we are embraced. By His Precious Blood, we are united in communion. Renewed in gifts of courage and strength, through faith, we are asked to lead people to the source of love and light. We gratefully come together to give thanks, to celebrate our adoption as God's sons and daughters, and to walk with one another; as in relationship with God, we become family. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Make a Gift Through an IRA Charitable Rollover

Normally, a distribution from your IRA is taxed as ordinary income. Tax legislation makes permanent a charitable giving opportunity throughout 2019 and into the future, for individuals 70½ or older. You may make a direct distribution (up to \$100,000) from your IRA to a qualified charity, such as your parish, the Bishop's Appeal, the Catholic Foundation, or another charitable institution. Such qualified direct distributions to charity from your IRA are not subject to income tax and your gift will count against your required distribution, reducing your income and taxes.. These gifts must be processed prior to January 1. If you are considering a charitable gift to the parish, please make your gift as soon as possible to avoid any processing delays at the end of the month. For more information about how you and the Church can benefit from an IRA charitable rollover, contact your tax preparer, financial advisor or the Catholic Foundation for the Diocese of Green Bay at 920-272-8173; or e-mail at catholicfoundation@gbdioc.org. (PLEASE NOTE: This pertains to a Traditional IRA only; Roth IRA's do not qualify for this exemption).

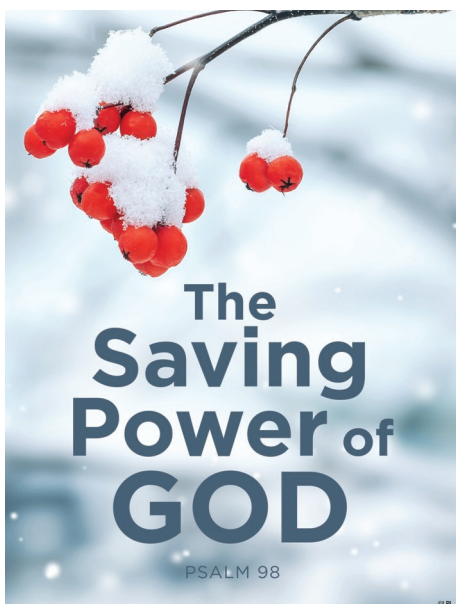

Financial Notes-Online Giving:

Parishioners have been asking about online giving for their parish contributions. We have looked into this, but due to the cost involved, have not moved forward with offering online contributions.

The parish finance councils are recommending:

1. Set up automatic withdrawals. These are set up through the parish; you tell us how much you would like to contribute and we withdraw that amount from either your checking or savings account each month, either on the 6th or 20th of each month. You decide which date works better for you. For more information, talk to MJ or Carol at the parish office (496-2160).
2. With most banks, you can have a check sent directly to the church, typically there isn't a cost to do this. You would have to check with your bank for details.

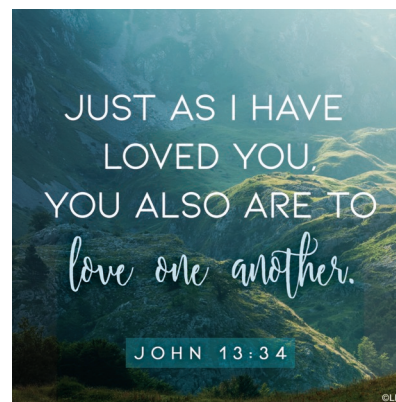

Prescriptions & Health Aids: Due to unforeseen circumstances the Green Bay Medical Sewing Mission can no longer accept any medications. Individuals can work with the Green Bay Police Dept. regarding proper disposal. We can still accept diabetic insulin/supplies, crutches, wheelchairs, commodes, braces, slings, hearing aids & glasses. They can be dropped off at the QP Office.

SEVERE WEATHER

There are no plans to cancel morning masses in case of severe weather; however, for safety reasons, be very conscientious about coming out in inclement weather. Your safety is of utmost importance and we cannot guarantee that parking lots will be cleared. Please use your best judgment. The Faith Formation Center, St. Patrick Food Pantry & Love Life will be closed when the schools close. Every attempt will be made to have the Quad-Parish offices open, but please call before coming since we may get in late or leave early. Our main concern is keeping everyone safe and we don't want you coming to the office if it is not open.

ATTN: SCRIP CARD USERS

When you pay with scrip or a gift card, do you sometimes have a small balance left on the card? Would you consider donating that card to those in need? We often get walk-ins requesting money to purchase gas, food, or prescriptions. The small balances left on your gift cards could add up to be enough to help someone have their next meal, pick-up a prescription, or purchase gas to get to a doctor appt, an out-of-town funeral, or to work the next day. Cards can be dropped in the collection baskets, or at the Quad-Parish or Faith Formation Office. It would be helpful if you would indicate the balance left on the card.

Do you have a special need for prayer? If you or someone you know needs a few extra prayers said for them, you can call the Quad-Parish Office at 496-2160.

Baptism
